Destination Cruises: A new offering on the TUG & BARGE TOUR 2011, we hope you will enjoy the trip on these icons of New York Harbor's Maritime Heritage. These are work trips, from point "A" to point "B". We appreciate your participation in this program. The fee of \$150 per person will further our ability to get out and show more New Yorkers the abundance of resources in this amazing harbor.

Rules:

- Listen to the Safety Officer's announcement and demonstration and directions from crew.
- Children 12 and under must wear a PFD (life jacket).
- Children 9 years old and under must be in physical control of an adult at all times while aboard the vessels.
- Children 9 years old and under are not permitted to venture around the vessels unescorted by the person in charge of them.
- Children under 9 years old and under require 1:1 adult supervision aboard the tug.
- Failure to control children will result in termination of the

Destination Cruise #1

July 14, Red Hook, Brooklyn (foot of Conover St.) to Pier 6, Brooklyn Bridge Park (foot of Atlantic Ave.)

Departure time: 10 AM. Please be aboard in Red Hook by 9 AM.

Duration: 2 hours, with close-up views of the Statue of Liberty, the Brooklyn Bridge and other fine monuments.

Disembark Pier 25, Brooklyn Bridge Park: 12 Noon

Destination Cruise #2

July 26, Brooklyn Bridge Park's Pier 6 (foot of Atlantic Ave.) to Hudson River Park's Pier 25 (Downtown Manhattan).

Departure time: 4 PM. Please be aboard at Brooklyn Bridge Park's Pier 6 by 1500.

Duration: 2 hours, with close-up views of the Statue of Liberty, the Brooklyn Bridge and other fine monuments.

Disembark Pier 25, Hudson River Park: 6 PM.

Destination cruise #3

August 1, Hudson River Park's Pier 25 (Downtown Manhattan) to Red Hook, Brooklyn (foot of Conover Street).

Departure time: 10 AM. Please be aboard at Hudson River Park's Pier 25 by 9 AM.

Duration: 2 hours, with close-up views of the Statue of Liberty, the Brooklyn Bridge and other fine monuments.

Disembark Red Hook, Brooklyn: 12 noon.

TO PARTICIPATE IN ONE OR MORE OF THESE TRIPS:

We are able to take 12 people on each vessel. Please reserve a place on the barge *Lehigh Valley No. 79* by emailing waterfrontmuseum@bigplanet.com and on the tug *Pegasus* by emailing info@tugpegasus.org. The cost is \$150 per person. Availability is on a first come first serve basis. After contacting us you will be sent a waiver. After payment, the signed waiver will serve as your boarding pass.
